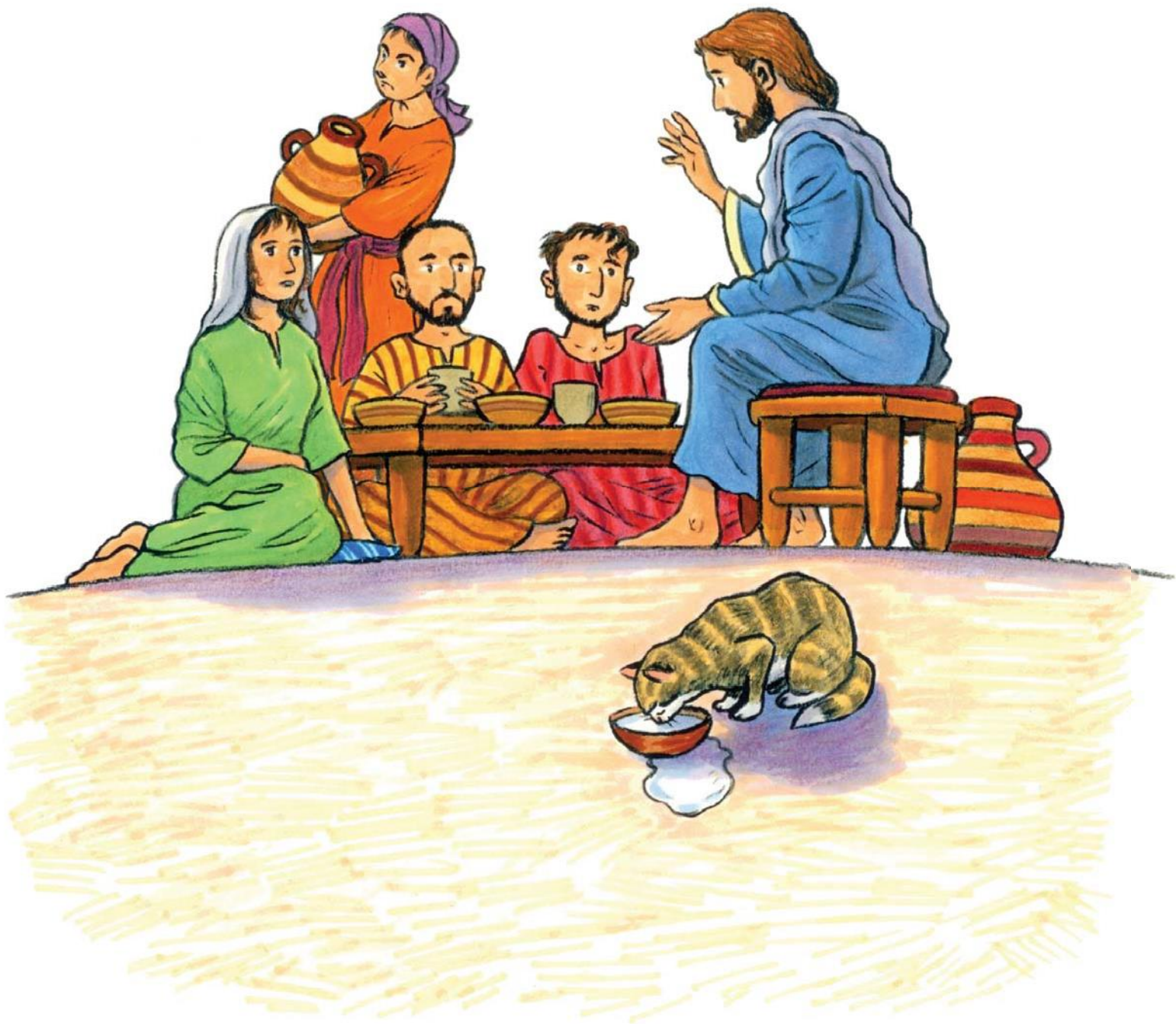


# MARY AND MARTHA

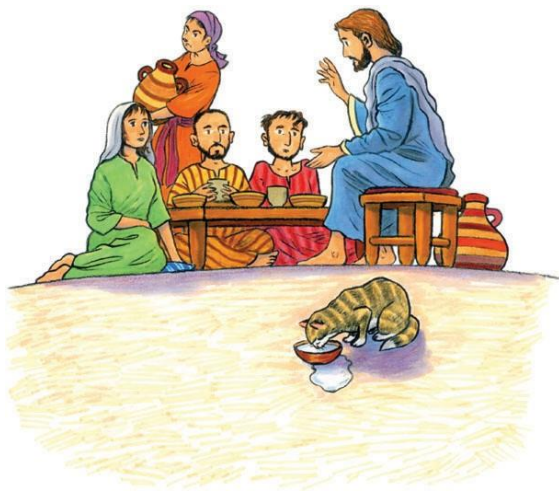
Luke 10:38-42

Message	We can be concerned with lots of things but we should make it a priority to listen to Jesus' teaching.
Learning Objectives	The children will learn: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>■ Different ways we can grow closer to Jesus each day.</li><li>■ Many things we do in life are important or expected by others, but they are not as important as listening to Jesus' teaching.</li></ul>
Bible Text	Luke 10:38–42

## Mary and Martha



Martha worked hard looking after Jesus. She went to Jesus and said, “Lord, do You not care that my sister has left me to do all the work? Tell her to help me!”

Jesus replied, “Martha, Martha. You are worried and troubled about many things, but only one thing is important. Mary has chosen the right thing and that cannot be taken away from her.”

Jesus and His disciples went to a village where a woman named Martha lived. She welcomed Jesus into her house.

Martha also had a sister, Mary. She sat at the Lord's feet and listened to what Jesus had to say.

### Suggestions for the Teacher

#### Lead-In

Show the picture to the children. Discuss with them what they see. Ask what she/he may feel...

Sing with the children an appropriate song about Jesus.

Provide two empty jars. Fill the first jar with little rocks. Then add sand until the jar is full.

Then remove the sand and put it in the second jar. Add the stones too. Less stones fit in the jar.

Sand represents the earthly things, the stones are the important ones. Give them priority

#### Lesson Instructions

Begin telling the story...

Discuss with the children...

- What does your family do when someone special comes for a visit?  
(We prepare the visit, provide food,...)
- How does Martha feel when doing all the work and Mary does not help her? (She is annoyed.)
- What would you do if Jesus visited your house? (Listen to Him, ...)
- What does Jesus talk about as Mary sits at His feet? (About his mission, about His Father, ...)
- What does Martha do? (She is worried about many earthly things.)
- What does Mary do? (She has chosen the most important thing: She listens to Jesus.)

Have the children repeat...

- Many things we do in life are important or expected by others.
- But they are not as important as listening to Jesus' teaching.

Real-Life Application (explain the following)

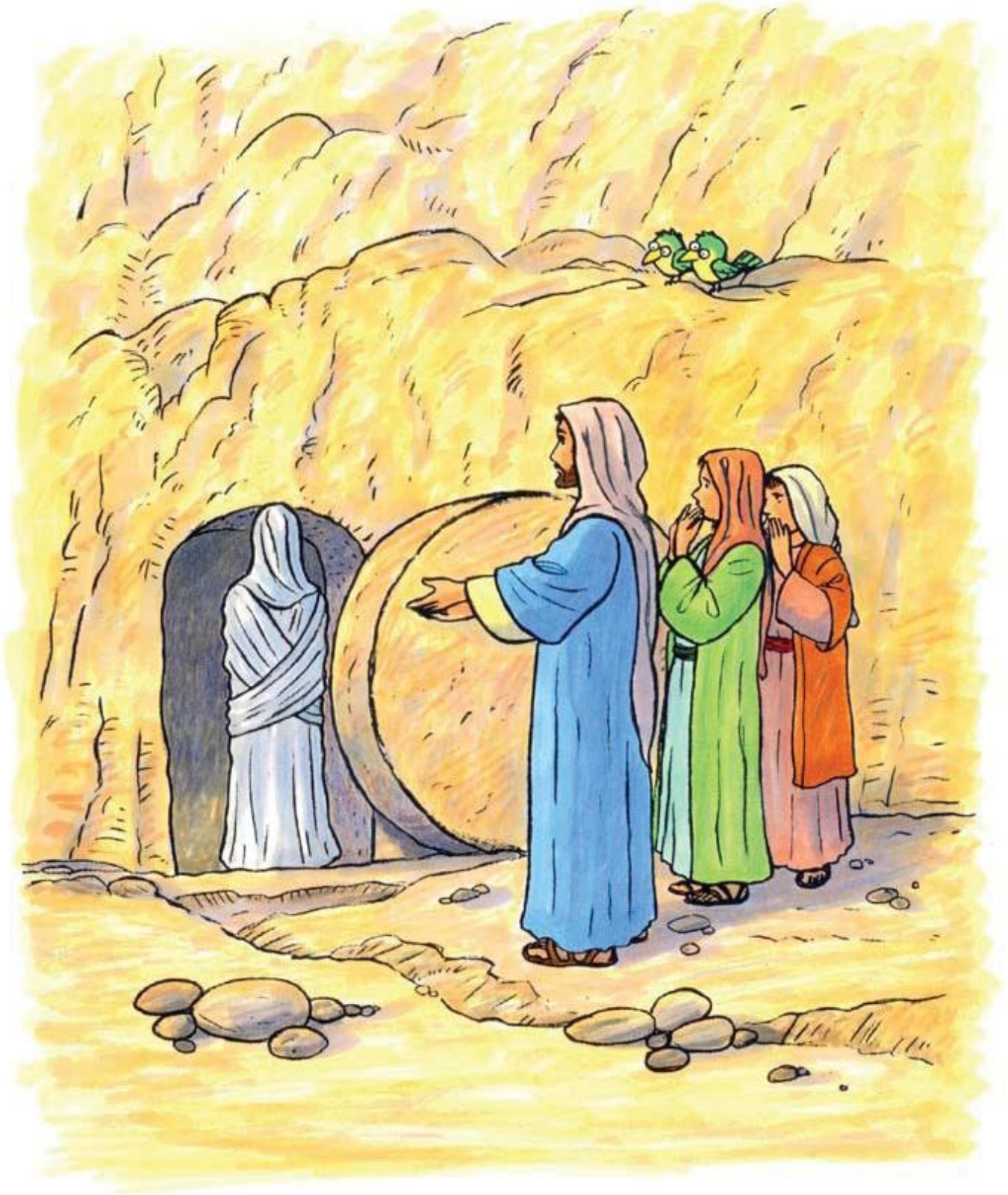
- Mary has chosen the most important thing: Listening to Jesus.
- What activities do your friends offer you on Sunday? (Playing football, visit a party, ...)
- Where do we hear the most important thing: Jesus' teaching? (Sunday school, divine service)

# LAZARUS

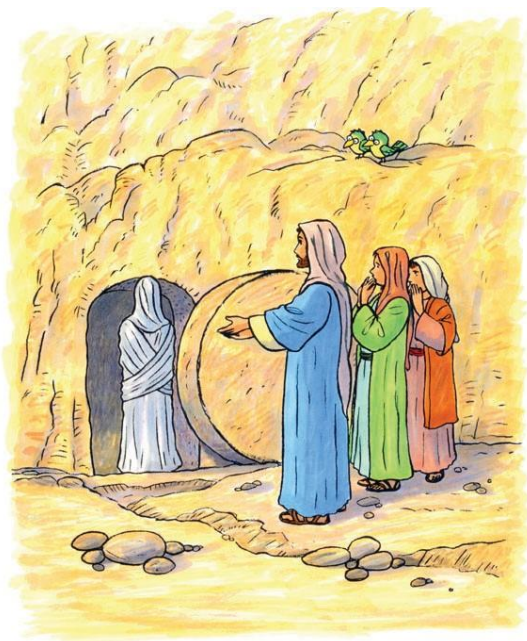
John 11:1-7, 11-45

## Lazarus



Jesus and His disciples were travelling when a messenger approached them and said, "Master, I am so happy to have found you. I am from Bethany. Mary and Martha have sent me to tell you that their brother Lazarus is very sick."

Jesus listened and said, "This sickness will not lead to death. God shall show the greatness of His power through it, and it will be the way through which the Son of God will be glorified."

Jesus loved Lazarus and his sisters. He had always enjoyed visiting them. But Jesus did not see the need to hurry there immediately.

Two days later Jesus decided to go to Bethany. He said, "Our friend Lazarus sleeps, but I go that I may wake him up."

The disciples said, "If he is sleeping then he will soon get well again." Jesus did not mean the natural sleep and said, "Lazarus is dead and I am glad for your sakes that I was not there, that you may believe. Nevertheless, let us go to him."

In Bethany, the two sisters were grieving over their beloved brother. He had been placed in a grave sealed with a big stone for four days by this time. Many people were still there to comfort them. When Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she hurried out to meet Him. She knew that Jesus could have prevented the death of Lazarus.

She said to Jesus, "If you had been here, my brother would not have died. But even now I know that whatever You ask of God, God will give You."

Jesus said, "Your brother will rise again." Martha said, "I know that he will rise again during the time of the resurrection."

Jesus answered, "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live. And whoever lives and believes in Me shall never die. Do you believe this?" Martha answered, "Yes, I believe that you are Christ, the Son of God, who has come into the world." Martha returned to her sister and said, "Mary, go and see! Jesus is here. He is asking for you." Mary hurried out to meet Jesus.

The people present followed her. Mary cried bitterly and said while falling on her knees, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died." Her grief touched Jesus and He was deeply moved. Jesus asked, "Where have you laid him?"

The people said, "Come with us, we will show you." They noticed that Jesus was crying and thought, "How He must have loved Lazarus! Why did He, who has healed so many sick, not prevent the death of Lazarus?" The tomb was a cave with a stone in front of it. Jesus ordered, "Take away the stone." Martha reminded Him that Lazarus had been in his grave for four days now. Jesus said to her, "Did I not say to you that if you believe, you would see the glory of God?"

Then they took away the stone from the cave. Jesus looked up to heaven, "Father, I thank You that You have heard Me. And I know that You always hear Me, but because of the people who are standing by I say this, that they may believe that You sent Me." After this, He called loudly, "Lazarus, come forth!" Everyone was looking at the entrance of the grave. Then Lazarus appeared still wearing grave clothes and with his face wrapped. Many of the people who came with Mary and Martha saw the things Jesus did and believed in Him.

## Suggestions for the Teacher

### Lead-In

Show the picture to the children. Discuss with them what they see. Ask what she/he may feel...  
Let some of the children play the story in a role-play. Instruct them before.  
Provide disguise / fancy dress...

### Lesson Instructions

#### Begin telling the story...

#### Discuss with the children...

- How does Jesus react when He hears the message that Lazarus is very sick?  
(He does not visit Bethany immediately. He knows that God will make Lazarus raise again.)
- What happens when Jesus comes to Bethany?  
(Martha meets Him and shows her confidence.)
- What does Jesus do?  
(He goes to the grave of Lazarus. He prays to God and says, "Lazarus, come out!")
- What happens then?  
(Lazarus, who had been in the grave for four days, comes out. Jesus brings him back to life.)

#### Have the children repeat...

- Jesus raised Lazarus from death to life.
- Jesus can give us eternal life if we follow Him in belief and trust.

#### Real-Life Application (explain the following)

- Although Lazarus had died, Martha trusted and believed in the Son of God.  
Jesus clearly showed that belief in Him results in eternal life.
- We want to believe in Jesus as Martha did, and trust Him so that we can come to eternal life.
- How do we show such faith?  
(Act in His mind, remain faithful, prepare for the day of the coming of Jesus with great joy...)
- What else do we need to obtain eternal life? (The sacraments in Gods house)

**Repeat the Message**  
**Jesus has power over life.**
