Jesus Cleanses the Temple

Suggestions for the Teacher

Lead-In

Show the picture to the children. Discuss with them what they see. Ask what she/he may feel.... Let some of the children play the story in a role-play. Instruct them before.

Provide disguise / fancy dress and additional materials like a little table, a whip, sale items...

Lesson Instructions

Begin telling the story...

Discuss with the children...

- What does Jesus see when He enters the temple?
 - At this time, the temple God's house is used as a market.
 - People change money, buy sacrificial animals, do trade.
- · How does Jesus react?
 - Jesus does not like them to do business to earn money in the temple.
 - He takes a whip and drives them out of the temple.

Have the children repeat...

- Jesus was angry that the traders did business in the temple.
- We want to keep God's house holy.

Real-Life Application (explain the following)

- The traders did not respect the temple of God.
- How do we behave in and around the house of God? (Pray, sanctify ourselves, listen, ...)

Repeat the Message We want to keep our hearts holy.
